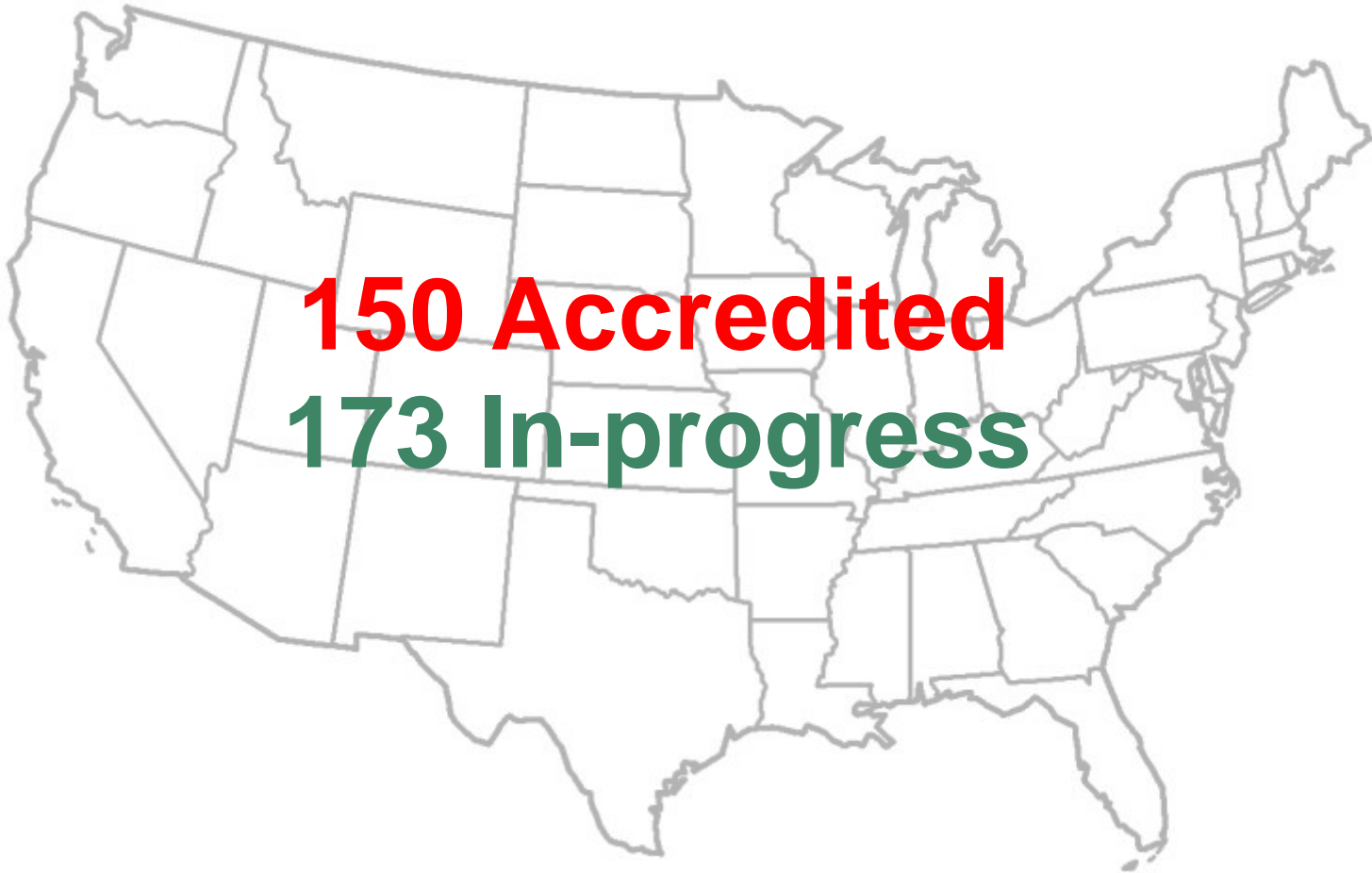

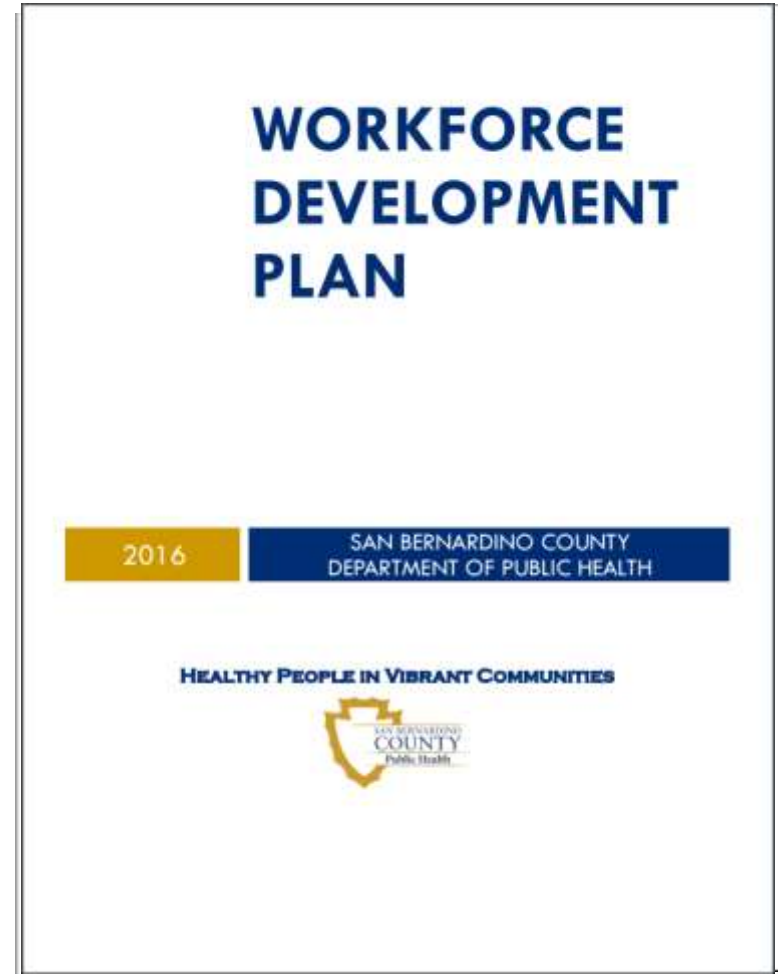

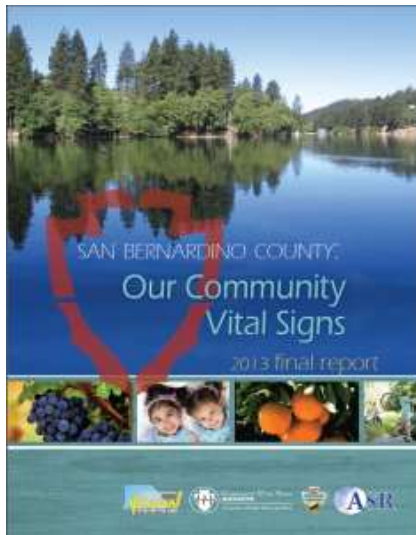

Major Component:

- Comprehensive Community Health Assessment



Focuses on the investigation of suspected or identified health problems or environmental public health hazards.

Major Component:

All Hazards/Emergency Operations Plan



Focuses on informing and educating the public about public health issues.

Major Component:

Risk Communication Plan



Focuses on community engagement.

Community members are important partners in:

- identifying and defining public health issues
- developing solutions or improvements
- advocating for policy changes
- communicating important information
- implementing public health initiatives



Focuses on the development of public health policies and plans.

Major Components:

- Community Health Improvement Plan
- Strategic Plan
- All Hazards/Emergency Operations Plan



Focuses on the role of public health departments in the enforcement of public health related regulations, executive orders, statutes, and other types of public health laws.



Domain 7 – Access to Care

Domain 7 focuses on the population's access to needed health care services.



MAJOR COMPONENTS:

- 1) Assess health care service capacity/access
- 2) Identify/implement strategies to improve access to health care services

Domain 8 – Workforce Development

Domain 8 focuses on the need for health departments to strategically approach the development of a competent workforce to perform public health duties.

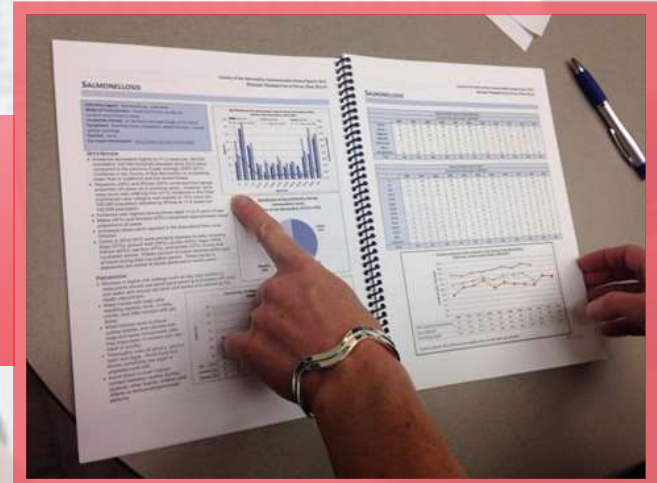


MAJOR COMPONENTS: Workforce Development Plan

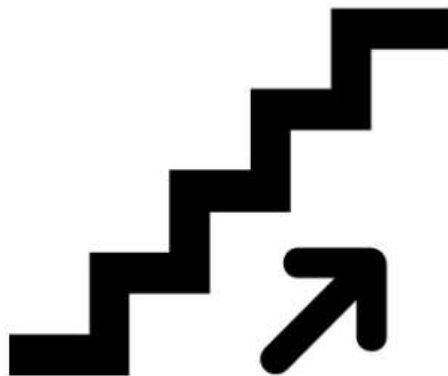

Round 2 Documentation Collection Deadline - September 23, 2016
PC/PM Accreditation Approval Training - October 21, 2016



Melissa Derwin (Supervising Medical Emergency Response Specialist, Preparedness & Response Program - PRP) is a new Domain Champion (DC) for Domain 2 (Investigate) and Domain 5 (Plan/Plan).

Melissa is replacing staff back as the PRP representative. Melissa has already received her training and is ready to take on this new challenge. She will join Susan Strong (Program Manager, Communicable Disease - CD) and Jason Priddy (Program Manager, Environmental Health Services - EHS) in Domain 2 and Odie Lewis (Program Coordinator, Community Vital Signs - CVS) in Domain 5.

Round 2 Documentation

The final Round 2 Documentation Collection deadline is September 23rd. There are approximately four (4) documents that fall under this timeline. Three (3) of those belong to CVS and the other to Administration to address Performance Management. Please make sure your programs are aware and on target with their submissions.

Accreditation Outreach

Francis has been busy wrapping up the Round 2 Accreditation Outreach efforts. Round 2 is taking place from July-September 2016 with a focus on Domains 4, 5 & 6 as well as discussing the Benefits of becoming an Accredited health department.

PM/PCs

Program Managers/Program Coordinators (PM/PCs) are taking on a new role in the Accreditation Process. They are now required to approve all documents being submitted by staff in their programs. This includes New/ Revised documents being uploaded to SharePoint for approval as well as documents that have already been evaluated as Fully/Largely meeting PHAB requirements, but require additional/improved mark-ups. Please see the attached "cheat sheet" for an overview of this new process. PM/PCs will receive SharePoint approval training at the October 21, 2016 PM/PC meeting.
